Division Updates –

Budget outlook - Tim Bean

 Replacement Vehicles – the new budget was launched in July and the economy is looking stable. The Division received funding to replace six vehicles for field staff, and will be requesting funding to replace 11 in the next fiscal year.

Legislative outlook – Tim Bean

- Workers Comp Grants for Volunteer Fire Protection Associations Currently
 working through Mo Dept of Conservation through an agreement on their Fire
 Department Equipment grant. Departments must have a mutual aid agreement
 with Conservation in order to be eligible for the grant. Division of Fire Safety will
 request full funding for FY21 in order to implement the law as intended.
- The Division is also hoping to pursue a statute change to expand the use of the in-house dedicated funds.

<u>Training partners summaries</u> - Sherry explained not all partners submitted summaries. An email was sent on July 25th to all partners asking for a summary to be submitted by August 12th for inclusion in the August 19th meeting discussion and decision making. Alan emphasized the importance of these reports and holding vendors accountable.

NFA Update – Becky explained that the NFA grants will not be funded this year. The nine regional deliveries will still be available to the State.

<u>Volunteer Fire Fighter Certification Program</u> – (Missouri Fire Fighter Professional Pathway) Tim Bean and Becky explained the thoughts of this new initiative, which would be approximately 240 hours with skills. Discussion regarding various levels of liabilities and changes to requirements. IFSTA training materials would be used. This program may positively impact ISO ratings.

<u>Learning Management System update</u> – Tim Bean/Becky

Tim explained the funding history for this program. Becky reviewed some pricing options for a new system. Discussion regarding the possibility of charging for testing and recertification to support on-going maintenance fees. This would require a change in statute to direct the fees into the Fire Ed Fund. The Commission agreed to support the system however pricing and other details will need to be finalized before determining to what extent.

New process for contracted course requests – Becky and Sherry reviewed new process with the group and fielded questions from the training partners. Contracts are still pending with OA therefore specifics of the RFP could not be discussed. OA indicated contracts should be issued by the end of the week. It was suggested that the Request for Contracted Training form be changed. The changes include a minimum number of students required and a disclaimer be added. The new form will be posted on the Division's website.

Other business - Comments/questions from guests

Matt Luetkemeyer reviewed MO Scope with the audience. Matt also explained that 136 departments still have not registered this year and are required to by law. Tim asked all in attendance to assist with this effort.

Light the Night – This is an initiative to recognize all fire service through the month of October. Requests have been made to light the Capitol and the Bridge across the Missouri River. Asking others to light their homes and firehouses in red during this time.

State Fire Marshal Stair Climb – The event is scheduled for October 19 at the Jefferson Building.

Close Before You Doze – This is an initiative to shut your bedroom door before you go to bed. This is in partnership with American Red Cross.
