Re: Amusement Ride Inspectors License

Amusement Inspectors license files have been found without specific required documentation relating to education and experience required by State Code of Regulations 11 CSR 40-6.060. Section (2) (A) thru (I).

Amusement Ride Inspectors Licenses are issued for a (12) month period each year to qualified inspectors that provide information on training and certification in the application process. Every license application is reviewed individually for proper updated certification and training documentation.

The Amusement Ride Safety Board has approved a committee to review the license qualification requirements in the State of Missouri. A proposed rule change has been submitted and approved on October 26, 2022 by The Amusement Ride Safety Board. The following are some proposed changes that may impact you:

Minimum qualifications for Amusement Ride inspectors;

- Elimination of 11CSR 40-6.060 (2) (D) thru (I)

Minimum qualifications of an Aerial Adventure Course Inspector;

- ACCT accreditation for Challenge Course /Zip Line Inspectors licenses or PRCA accreditation for Challenge Course / Zip line Inspectors Licenses or
- Shall provide documentation as being certified by an industry-recognized organization not listed above.

Such request shall be reviewed for approval by the director. Request shall be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and approval is at the sole discretion of the director.

Fees: New Rule proposal 11 CSR 40-6.105

Initial Amusement Ride and Aerial Adventure Course Inspectors License and renewal, a fee of seventy five dollars (\$75.00) for a one (1) year license
